Memorandum of Understanding

This MoU is executed on 20.01.2017 between Siddhant College of Pharmacy, Pune and Citron Institute of Pharmaceutical Education & Research(CIPER) Pune, a premier center of Excellence, berein after referred to as "CIPER Pune" which expression shall mean and include repugnant to context hereof, its successor-in-interest, administrators and assigns

AND Siddhaut College of Pharmacy, Pane 412109

herein after referred to as "SCOP" which expression shall man and include unless repugnant to context hereof, it's successors-interest, administrators and assigns

Whereas

Citron Institute of Pharmaceutical Education & Research(CIPER) Pune, conducts Industrial staff training programs for BSC, MSC, D.Pharm, B.Pharm, M.Pharm candidates for different pharmaceutical companies, involved in research and development projects, Assisting in placements for different Pharmaceutical, Food, Engineering etc., related to production, QA, QC, Stores and marketing areas. "SCOP" is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, (D. Pharmacy program is affiliated to MSBTE.) Maharashtra and approved by All India council for technical education (AICTE) and Pharmacy council of India(PCI) offering D. Pharmacy, B. Pharmacy, M. Pharmacy programs in Pharmaceutical Sciences.

Whereas

The parties have discussed and deliberate on various items of mutual interest and benefits and have deemed expedient to execute this memorandum of understanding so as to mutually cooperate in validating allopathic products and assays and joint publication.

1. Sharing of Facilities

- 1.1 Both the organizations agree to share their respective R & D facilities in order to promote academic and research interaction.
- 1.2 There will be provision for mutual sharing of experts from SCOP and CIPER Pune.

2. Joint R & D Projects

- 2.1 Research projects in the identified areas will be jointly undertaken by CIPER Pune and SCOP Pune in areas agreed by both parties wherever possible. Both the organizations will submit collaborative research projects to various national and international funding agencies. Both the organizations would ensure the successful completion of the funded research projects.
- 2.2 For all the matters concerned a coordination committee overseeing the issues consisting of five members (Two members from CIPER Pune, two members from SCOP with the Chairman on rotation basis) for identifying joint R & D projects to be carried out under this CIPER Pune and SCOP as registered under law.

3. Technology transfer:

3.1 Both CIPER Pune and SCOP agreed to share the technology whenever feasible.

4 Joint conference / Workshops/ Courses

4.1 Both CIPER Pune and SCOP agreed to hold/ conduct whenever feasible, joint Conference/Workshop/Hands on training programs.

5. Industrial visits:

5.1 Both CIPER and SCOP agreed to organize industrial visits whenever feasible, for the students, staffs and delegates during the Conference /Workshop/Hands on training programs.

6. Industrial training:

6.1 Both CIPER and SCOP agreed to give opportunity for on job training to the students and staff of CIPER and SCOP with other companies tied up with CIPER and training programs organized by CIPER whenever feasible related to technology, analytical development, validation and documentation.

7. Placements:

7.1 CIPER agreed to organize Campus interviews in CIPER and off campus interview in SCOP for the students of D.Pharm, B.Pharm and M.Pharm, whenever feasible related to F&D, Production, Quality Assurance and Quality Control departments.

8. Internships:

8.1 Both CIPER Pune and SCOP agreed to provide summer internships to students is another area. This helps in motivating the students, understanding industry environment and practices, job profiles, projects they can undertake besides facilitating them to carn some money to be spent usefully in the next academic year / semester.

9. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY, CONFIDENTIALITY AND NON-DISCLOSURE

- 9.1 Both parties recognize, accept and agree that all tangible and intangible information obtained or disclosed to the other party or its staff or employees including all details, documents, patient information an particulars and trade secrets (all of which are hereinafter referred to as confidential and / or proprietary information) of such party which may be communicated to other party, its staff / employees who may be privy under or pursuant to this contract and / or in the course of performance of such party's obligations under this contract shall be treated as absolutely confidential and the other party agrees and undertakes to ensure that it and all its staff / employees shall keep the same as secret and confidential and shall not disclose the same, at all in whole or in part to any person at any purpose other than as may be necessary for due performance of the party's obligations herein and only for the benefit of the other party.
- 9.2 Both parties hereby unconditionally agree and undertake to ensure that they or their staff / employees shall not disclose or publish the existence of the terms and conditions of this contract or any information relating to it or other business which they may come across of performing their duties unless such disclosure or publication is strictly required by law or by any authority acting under law.

10. Duration, Amendment and Termination of MoU

10.1 This MoU shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of its signing. During the period of the validity, the MoU can be amended any time by mutual consent of both the parties in writing. The MoU can also be terminated by either party giving the order a written notice of its desire to terminate the MoU by giving three months notice in advance. In the

11. Dispute Resolution and Governing Law

- 11.1 The dispute or issue if any arising out of or touching this Agreement if not resolved amicably shall be referred to an arbitration of an arbitrator mutually agreed by the parties. In the event parties fail to agree on single arbitrator then each party shall appoint third arbitrator. The arbitration will be held in Bangalore. The Language of the arbitration shall be in English.

1. OBJECTIVES


Citron Life Sciences Pvt. Ltd. and Siddhant College of Pharmacy will undertake joint research work in the areas of mutual interest:

- Both the organizations agree to share and utilize equipments, facilities, hardware, software and other materials & components developed in house in the area of co-operation if advisable within the framed rules governing both the organizations.
- Access to laboratory, library and other supporting facilities for jointly supervised UO, PG and Research will be provided by both institutes.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

Rubicon Skill Development Pvt. Ltd.

For Training students on Rubicon's Campus to Corporate Program

This Memorandum of Understanding is made at Pune on 25th day of February 2019.

Siddhant College of Pharmacy, Sudumbre, (Maharashtra). Here in after referred to as "THE COLLEGE" (Which term shall so far as the context admits be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) of the First Part,

AND

Rubicon Skill Development Private Limited a Company incorporated and registered under the Companies Act, 2013, having its Corporate office at 801, 8th Floor, Tower 1, World Trade Centre, Pune 411014, Maharashtra, hereinafter referred to as "Rubicon" (which term shall so far as the context admits be deemed to mean and include its successors, administrators, executors and assignees) of the Second Part.

1. Introduction

THE COLLEGE has decided to partner with RUBICON for the conduct of Tomorrow's Foundation Connect with Work Program (hereinafter referred to as "Training Program") at THE COLLEGE.

THE COLLEGE Responsibilities:

- 2.1 Shall nominate one person with adequate accountability and responsibility to coordinate the Training Program. He / She would act as the single point of contact for the proposed Programme.
- Shall make available the infrastructure (including IT infrastructure, applications and connectivity) required to conduct the Training Program.
- 2.3. Shall provide all the support services and facilities to RUBICON during the conduct of the said Training Program. Adequate power backup through UPS and DG supplies during the training sessions
- 2.4. Shall coordinate with RUBICON and facilitate conduct of all the assessments including the assessment to be conducted by the external agency (if any) identified by RUBICON, as per schedule communicated by RUBICON.
- 2.5. Provide lodging, wherever available, as per the standards of RUBICON for faculty conducting the Training Programme for the total duration of the Training Programme plus two days (one day prior and one day after closure). The lodging so planned to be provided should be with independent room (with attached toilet), regular water supply, clean, with access to boarding facilities, should have well lit approach and surroundings, have adequate safety & protection and peaceful environment.
- 2.6. Shall share the details of students in a prescribed format to ensure that there is no duplication of beneficiaries
- 2.7. This is a multi-year program to create social impact. The college shall share few details to assess the impact of the program. For e.g. Placement details of trained students will be required to assess the impact of the program from one year to another year.

3. Rubicon Responsibilities:

- Will provide necessary training as per Training Programme requirements and curriculum for delivery as per Annexure I to this MOU
- 3.2. Will provide suitable faculties for the training exclusive for classroom training
- 3.3. Will conduct assessment of its own and also arrange external assessment as required.

4. Other Terms & Conditions:

The following are other terms and conditions of engagement:

- 4.1. Batch Size: The batch size would need to be a min/ max of 35-40.
- 4.2. Each student would be made available for the Training Program for specified number of hours per day for the duration of the Training Program
- 4.3. Pre-assessment & Selection: RUBICON may carry out pre-assessment of the students who have applied for the course and shortlist the select candidates to undergo the Training Program. The final decision on selection of candidates eligible to take the Training Program shall be with RUBICON.

4.4. Programme schedule:

- 4.4.1. Training Program scheduled commencement date 5th March 2019
- 4.4.2. Scheduled Completion Date: and will be completed by not later than : 7th March 2019

4.5. Commercials

4.5.1. Training Fees: The training Fees is as follows,

Since this is a CSR funded Program there is no fee payable by THE COLLEGE for this Training Program

4.5.2. Payment Terms
 Not Applicable

4.6. Certification

Students who are successful in the assessment conducted by RUBICON shall be awarded a certificate post completion of the training program.

4.7. Term of engagement:

This MoU is valid from the date of sign off by both parties for a period of Two years, however both parties agree that based on mutual agreement, the terms may be extended. Both parties also agree that terms may be renegotiated.

4.8. Limitations and Warranties:

Both parties agree that it would be their endeavour to prevent any liability arising out of default or non-compliance of the MoU terms by the other party.

4.9. Termination:

- 4.9.1. Both parties can terminate the MoU with a prior written thirty (30) day notice on default of terms of non-adherence to any condition or responsibilities by the other party as outlined in this MoU in case such default is not rectified within such 30 days.
- 4.9.2. Both parties also agree that it would be their professional endeavour that despite any termination of the MOU, progress would continue, without any prejudice to the ongoing Training Programmes, which would be without any hindrance and would be progressed for completion.

General Terms:

- Both the parties may receive information proprietary to other party (the Confidential Information) in the course of performance of their obligations under this MOU. Confidential Information is not meant to include any information which (a) is publicly available (b) is rightfully received by the parties from third parties without accompanying secrecy obligations; (c) is already in either party's possession and was lawfully received from sources other than the parties or (d) is independently developed by the parties. The two bodies understand and acknowledge that the Confidential Information is valuable and confidential and agrees that it will at all times be kept in trust to be disclosed only to such persons as have a "need to know" the same for the effective implementation of this MOU and that it will only be used by the parties for the benefit of others.
- 5.2. Both the parties understand and agree that all written or other tangible data and documentation developed or procured by the other party in performing its obligations under this MOU, whether in printed or electronic form, belongs to other party and that other party will have all rights, titles and interests therein.

- 5.3. Both parties shall not use the name and brand of other party in any advertisement or make any public announcement without the prior written approval of the other.
- 5.4. Each party shall be at liberty to terminate this MOU with a written notice period of three (3) month to the other party without any compensation and seeking legal redress.

6 Jurisdiction:

In the event of any litigation, the court of jurisdiction shall be Pune.

7. Indemnification

Both parties agree to indemnify each other and hold the other party harmless from and against any claim, loss, liability, or expense, including, but not limited to, damages, patent, and trademark infringement, costs and attorneys' fees, arising out of or in connection with any acts or omissions of their agents or employees, as related to the terms of this MoU.

Any claim, compensation, case initiated by any student against Aricent in relation to the Training Program due to any acts or omissions of COLLEGE and/or RUBICON shall be defended and contested by the COLLEGE and RUBICON at their sole expenses and cost keeping Aricent indemnified from the same.

Limitation of Liability:

Except for the indemnification obligations, both parties agree that the liability would be limited to the amount of actual transactions between the two parties

Notices:

Any notices under this MOU will be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the respective address of Parties as contained in this MOU. Such notice will be effective upon its mailing as specified.

10. Intellectual Property Rights

10.1 RUBICON explicitly warrants that it owns all the intellectual properties related to content in all formats, the technology framework and all other related objects and the THE COLLEGE has no rights to use the content and mode of delivery for any other purpose.

- 20.2. Each party hereby undertakes to inform the other party of any violation of Intellectual Property Rights or its unlawful use, under prevalent laws of India. Further, each of the party herein, agrees to co-operate with the other to the extent possible in the process of investigating such cases of any violation of Intellectual Property Rights or its unlawful use and taking legal action against the said infringement.
- 10.3.
